## Christian Devotion on How The Holy Spirit reveals Spiritual Truths

"But the natural, nonspiritual man does not accept or welcome or admit into his heart the gifts and teachings and revelations of the Spirit of God, for they are folly (meaningless nonsense) to him; and he is incapable of knowing them [of progressively recognizing, understanding, and becoming better acquainted with them] because they are spiritually discerned and estimated and appreciated." - 1 Corinthians 2:14 (AMPC)

This particular scripture spoke to me many years ago when I first came to the Lord. I realized then that you cannot understand spiritual truths if you do not have the indwelling Holy Spirit.

To the non-spiritual man (non-Christian), the things of God are foolishness to him. A lot of things don't make sense to the non-spiritual man. The Bible is full of 'spiritual truths' and we need the indwelling Holy Spirit to speak to us to 'reveal' the hidden truths in it.
